SHSSN aims to enhance the lives of students, by creating opportunities to take part in sport either as participant, leader or performer. Founded on the Olympic and Paralympic values, our work promotes self-esteem, healthy and active lifestyles, and the development of life skills. We believe that a thriving sports provision in our area can best be achieved by schools working together across age groups in local hubs, in a spirit of genuine partnership.

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SHSSN grew out of Barnhill School Sports Partnership, which has existed since 2006. When the funding changed in 2011, SHSSN was the successor organisation, and has been operating since September 2011. Over this time SHSSN has worked with 14 Primary schools in 2 clusters (Barnhill and Long Lane), I Special Primary (Hedgewood), I Special School (Meadow) and 3 Secondary schools (Barnhill, Swakeleys and Abbotsfield).

SHSSN now has it's own Board, which is made up of Primary and Secondary Headteachers, with primary schools being the driving force behind the group. We believe that moving forward, SHSSN can continue to benefit local schools and their students.

Barnhill and Swakeleys are continuously committed to putting their resources into the partnership via staff release time, as they have valued the work of the partnership over many years.

Excellence

Last year we introduced the SHSSN Infant School Games Mark to address the lack of PE and School Sport accreditation for Key Stage I. This was modelled on the successful Silver and Gold schools who were offered the opportunity to submit their applications.



The School Games is a programme delivered through a partnership between the Department for Culture, Media and Sport, the British Paralympic Association,

In 2011-12 there were only 2 SHSSN schools achieving a bronze and silver award. This number has grown, year on year and in 2014-15 SHSSN schools have done fantastically well with their School Games Marks and achieved an amazing 2 bronze, 2 Silver and 7 Gold School

Games Marks. Well done to all of our schools for applying for the Games Mark and progressing up a level, especially to







Hayes Park, Hillingdon, St Andrews, St Bernadettes, Highfield, Oak Farm Junior and Yeading Junior for achieving GOLD.













Young Coaches Academy

In December 2015, Yasmine Ferguson (Platinum Ambassador) and Luke Miller (Silver Ambassador) from Barnhill Community High, applied to become part of the London Youth Game, Young Coaches Academy. Out of 43 applicants, Yasmine and Luke were chosen to take part in the scheme along with another 23 students from the London area.



The academy has been established to create a clearer pathway between the developments of young coaches in schools to the community setting. Yasmine and Luke have taken part in a variety of training sessions that have helped develop their leadership and employability skills, with particular focus on understanding and developing a coaching philosophy, as well as considering honesty and ethics when delivering sport. They have both now be assigned a club to volunteer at and will have a big part to play in this year's London Youth Games at Crystal Palace.

Olympic / School Games Festivals

This gives Secondary students the opportunity to lead over 400 primary students from Year 2 and Year 4 in various sporting activities. It also gives the primary students a chance to come and see their local secondary school and be active and have fun at the same time. The 100 plus leaders used to run the event gain valuable leadership skills and it often gives them the confidence to go on and volunteer more inside and outside of school. At each of the events the underlying theme was the Olympic and Paralympic values and students are rewarded for displaying these values.

This year Young Ambassadors were given the responsibility to also run an opening and closing ceremony for the event.

GamesForce Event

20 Barnhill student leaders have taken part in the GamesForce Event Award this year which has given them the opportunity to train and volunteer at the London Youth Games. Last year, over 60 school teams from across London volunteered in a variety of roles such as physical activity leaders, event coordination assistants and ceremonies coordinators. Barnhill leaders have already volunteered at the London Youth Games, Spring Sportshall Athletics finals and are set to volunteer at Crystal Palace in the Fan Fest, helping Disability Sports coach's deliver inclusive sports session to primary school groups.

Leadership Academy

In September 2015, the newly appointed student leaders took part in the SHSSN Leadership Academy launch at Barnhill Community High. Y9- 11 students from Barnhill (25) and Swakeleys (15) were inducted into the leadership scheme by Mr Squires and our Young Ambassadors.

Barnhill and Swakelys now have over 100 students involved in leadership and volunteering over the course of the year. Many of the students have also undertaken leadership roles at taster weeks where they coached primary students in sports including tri-golf, dance, BMX, Taekwondo, footgolf and boccia and new age curling.

Peer Leaders

In May 2015, ten student leaders from Barnhill and ten from Swakeleys took part in the Young Ambassador Peer Leaders conference. The programme aimed to empower Year 5 - 9 students to lead and deliver activities and to improve PE and school sport within their school. Funded by the Department for Education, this intervention programme aims to provide primary, secondary and specialist schools across England with the opportunity to increase the activity levels of the least active young people in their school. Inclusive and engaging delivery of this is led by the YA Peer Leader.

Leadership

Student leaders from Barnhill and Swakeleys are assisting sports coaches to run Change4Life Clubs at five local schools: Grange Park, Hayes Park, Belmore, Yeading Infants and Yeading Junior. These clubs help pupils to become more physically active enabling



them to work together in small groups to overcome challenges and live healthier lifestyles. Barnhill and Swakeleys Student Leaders have organised and run their Autumn Change4Life festivals to primary students. Students were able take part in a variety of sporting activities, where they were challenged and gained in confidence.

Barnhill and Swakeleys has also hosted four Sportshall Athletics events for both primary and secondary schools. Student leaders helped to set up and clear away the competition, officiated during the field and track events as well as record scores and times. They have been extremely helpful and have contributed to the smooth running of the competition along with the PE staff at Barnhill and Swakeleys.

Olympic & Paralympic Award Ceremony

All primary and secondary schools in SHSSN are currently nominating seven students for each of the Olympic and Paralympic values.

This will be celebrated at an awards ceremony at the Beck Theatre in June during the National School Sports Week and on the World Olympic Day. Parents, teachers, and school governors will be there to help celebrate the students' achievements. Last year, the guest speaker was Emma Croker, who is the 2014 Women's Rugby World Cup Winner.

This year our guest speaker is Steve Brown - Captain of the London 2012 paralympic GB wheelchair rugby team.

John Brennan Award

Last years we added an additional special award called the "John Brennan Award", which went to the individual that encompassed all of the values the most. This award is a legacy to John Brennan who sadly died last year, but who helped to make SHSSN what it is, by putting young people at the centre of sport in South Hillingdon Schools. Last year a well deserving Annie Hewitt from Swakeleys School for Girls won the award.



Competitions & Festivals

SHSSN has increased the number of sports that students can get involved in this year by providing specific opportunities for students who don't normally take part. Our ethos at these festivals is to allow students to experience competition in a fun and inclusive environment.

We want students to learn that the Olympic and Paralympic values and fair play are important to succeed in sport and hope that they also take these in to their everyday life.

This year we have run the following sports for Y5/6 B and C Teams and Years 3 & 4 and Year 2: BMX. Taekwondo, Tri-Golf. Footgolf and Dance. We have also run the following Hillingdon Borough Primary and Secondary events: Sports Hall Athletics, Gymnastics, Quadkids, TriGolf and Handball.

Inclusive Competitions

This year with the support of Meadow and Pield Heath RC School, we have also run 3 inclusive competitions for Special Schools and Mainstream Schools for pupils who may struggle to access other competitions.
