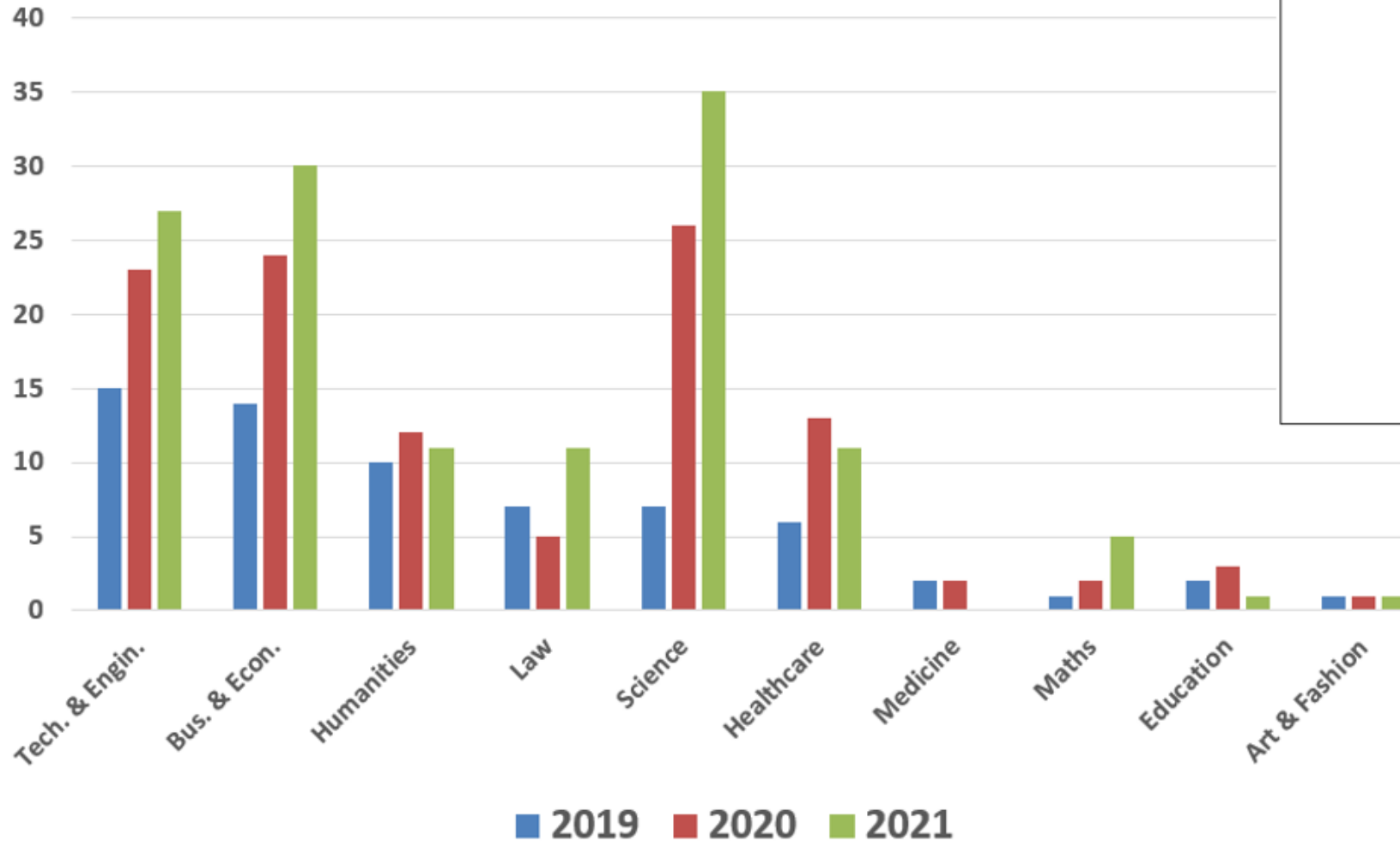


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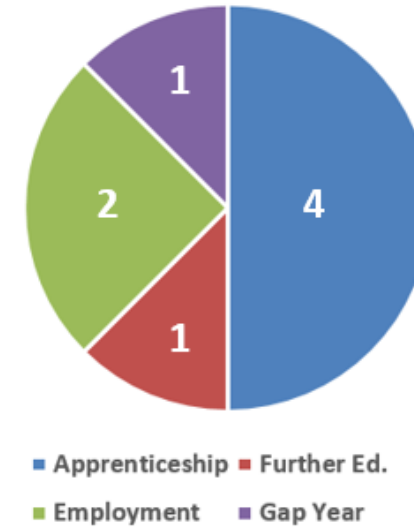
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Student Destination Degrees 2019 - 2021

How and why do we set aspirational targets?

- ▶ Based on KS2 assessments (End of Year 6)
- ▶ KS3 targets are 'descriptive' targets
 - ▶ Mostly mastered, some secure, mostly developing, some secure etc...
- ▶ Targets are used to foster ambition in students and are purposefully aspirational. We encourage our students to challenge themselves to be the best they can and be able to compete with their counterparts to achieve success in school and beyond.

- ▶ It is crucial for students to take time to reflect on their achievements, consolidate what they have done well and plan for what they need to do better.
- ▶ After every data entry students receive their reports with the reflection questions on an A5 sticker to place inside their planner. The same reports are sent home via post and email (although from next year, we would like to just use email!)

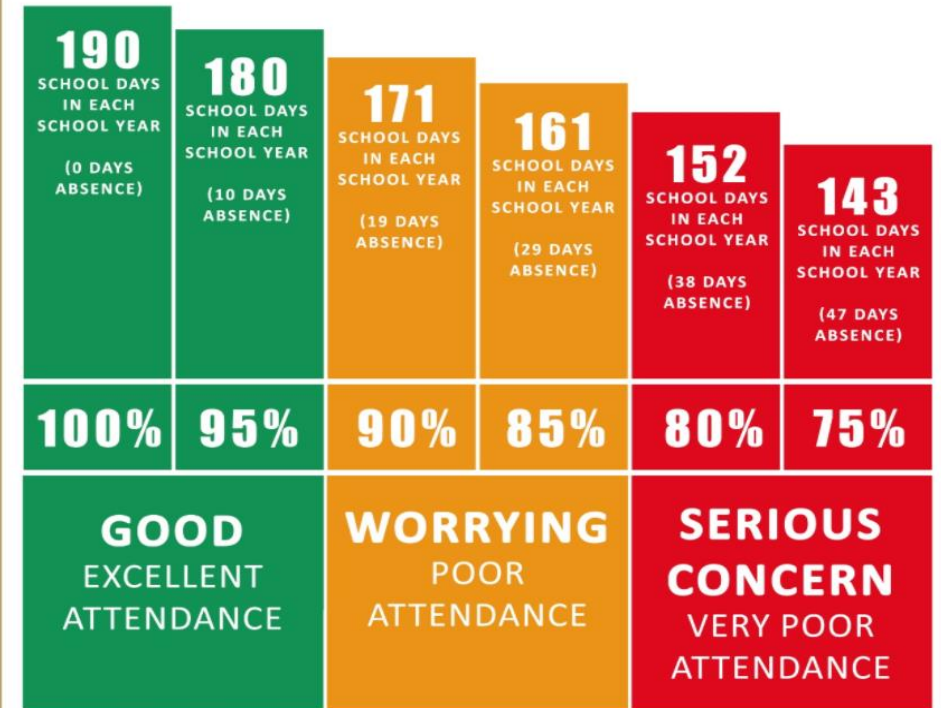

Homework Guidelines

	Homework Guidelines	Per night
KS3	<p>1 homework task per week for English, Maths, History, Geography, Science and Languages (20-30 minutes)</p> <p>1 homework task per fortnight for creative subjects (20-30 minutes)</p> <p>30 minutes reading per day</p>	<p>1 hr for Year 7</p> <p>1.5 hours for Year 8/9</p>
KS4	<p>English 1 hour per week</p> <p>Maths 1 hour per week</p> <p>Science 1 hour per week (30 minutes per subject)</p> <p>Options subjects x 4 (1 hour per week)</p> <p>Independent revision, reading and study (2.5 hours per week)</p> <p>Total = 10 hours per week</p>	2 hours
KS5	<p>2 x homework tasks a week per subject (60 minutes)</p> <p>10 hours independent study and reading</p> <p>Total= 16 hours per week</p>	2.5 hours

Top tips for parents to support:

- **Have they got a quiet area in the home to complete the work?**
- **Have you discussed what homework is due?**
- **Have you discussed what the homework is about?**
- **Have you spent time with your children to understand whether they have completed the homework to the best of their ability?**

Advice to Staff

- ▶ Sanctions for non-completion
- ▶ If homework is not done the best strategy is to keep pupils back to complete the homework. Repeated non-completion of homework should be logged which will result in a central detention for the student.
- ▶ If a pupil continues to not complete homework a phone call home could be made. The CL and HOY should be informed. The pupil can be put on homework report to the CL or on HW report by the HOY if this is a wider issue.

Advice to Parents

- ▶ Parental expectations for homework
- ▶ Please check and sign the pupil planner weekly. Please ask to see the homework that has been completed.
- ▶ Engage in a dialogue with your child about the homework- ask your children to summarise their learning and “*articulate their thinking*”. This really helps children to put learning into their long-term memory.
- ▶ Ask pupils to see their teacher before homework is handed in if they have any difficulties
- ▶ Create a space and time for completing homework at home.

What could parents do to support further?

- ▶ Continuously talk to your child about their future plans and encourage them to be ambitious, emphasizing how important their attendance, attitude towards learning and hard work is to achieve their aspirational goals
- ▶ Talk to your child about their assessment grades and predictions after each data entry point. You receive this report via email and post but is also accessible on Go 4 Schools with your unique login and password. If you have any problems accessing Go 4 Schools, please contact barnhilldatateam@Barnhill.School
- ▶ After each data entry point, students will have a reflection session with the form tutor where they set targets for their areas of development. This will be in their school planners. Please discuss these reflections with your children

- ▶ Look at the work and homework being completed in their books/digital book and feedback being given to them and discuss this with them
- ▶ Ensure children come to school on time, fully equipped and ready to learn
- ▶ Proactivity - Students should always be encouraged to talk to teachers, ask questions, clarify misunderstandings, ask for help
- ▶ Students' ownership - Know the grades and ask, 'What do I need to do to improve?'
