

## Russell Group reading list for key subjects

Dear Year 12 student,

Please find below a set of reading lists for various university courses. I'll negotiate with Sixth Form team to see if we can get some of these books into the school library or my shelves.

Some advice on how to use this:

- This sounds silly, but books are hard. Studies show that poor diet, lack of sleep, stress and time spent looking at screens all diminish our attention spans. Try to set aside time for reading, possibly before school or just before bed (it makes an excellent pre-bed wind-down).
- Keep a reading log so that you know what you've read and can remember key details when it comes to UCAS Statements and interviews.
- Some of the books you'll find here have more relevance to your A Levels than others. Ask your teachers for guidance as to what to target first if you aren't sure.
- The majority of these books will have bibliographies, references, or further reading lists. If something interests you in the book and you want to know more about it, these lists are great places to start.
- There will be overlap and shared interest between lists, so look at books from other courses as well!
- Reading varies in its relevance across subjects. On the one hand, you will need to demonstrate your capacity to practically inhale books if you want to study something that is heavily reliant on written material, such as English, History or Law. On the other hand, something like work experience will be more pressing for vocational subjects with more practical elements, such as Dentistry or Medicine (although you should read for these too!).
- If you don't understand a term you see in a book, Google it. There's no point sitting there feeling stupid and sorry for yourself if you have the capacity to do something about it.
- If you don't like the books under a certain course heading, that's fine, but don't doggedly stick to that choice of course. It's probably an indication that you wouldn't like studying that subject for three years at vast expense, so have another think.
